

Conflicts of Interest

Conflicts of interest have become a fact of life as work and personal lives become more intertwined. And they've become much more visible - impacting your workplace culture, reputation, and brand.

This Conflicts of Interest program introduces learners to what conflicts of interest are and how they can influence decision-making and reputation. It also shows learners how even the perception of a conflict of interest can hurt the trust and reputation of the people involved.

This program focuses on giving learners practical guidance - particularly to those who may assume that a conflict of interest automatically means they've done something wrong.

This program teaches learners about:

- What conflicts of interest are
- The appearance of conflicts of interest
- How to identify conflicts of interest
- How people get into trouble by mishandling conflicts of interest
- Common conflicts of interest related to personal relationships, financial interests and activities.

Live action video workplace scenes show learners how these issues can be raised and often easily resolved. We also give learners direct access to experts and the ability to anonymously ask questions from within the program while questions are fresh in their minds.
